LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION AND LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

Language of instruction: **Spanish**

- Students must have an intermediate to advanced level of Spanish to enroll in the mobility program.
- Candidates must take a Spanish placement exam proving CEFR B2 level (DELE or SIELE).
- Students who do not have an official certificate must take a Spanish exam at La Salle.
- It is important to follow the decision made by the head of the Spanish department.
- Spanish classes have an extra cost and offer academic credit.
- Costs will be provided at student's arrival.
- We offer an *English Pathway* within the Business School, where selected courses are available in English. Students must be approved by their home university and are required to take Spanish for Foreigners (fees apply) as part of this pathway.

EXCHANGE STUDENT INFORMATION

1. Application form and documents required:

Through <http://bit.ly/LaSalleInternacional> the home university registers students online, includes list of [requested courses](#), and supporting documents in a single-color PDF:

2. Health insurance requirements:

Students must have an international health insurance plan with coverage in Mexico for their entire duration of their exchange program. Coverage must include repatriation of remains. Prior to arrival, students must hand a copy of their insurance policy.

3. Accommodation:

Universidad La Salle **does not offer on campus accommodation**. However, [Home-stays](#) with Mexican families are available within walking distance from campus. *Monthly plans vary from \$7,700 MX to \$10,000 MX (subject to change).*

Application deadline is 30 days before arrival date. Students may do their own housing arrangements under their full responsibility. Living in the *Condesa-Roma* area is highly recommended.

4. Air transportation:

Universidad La Salle's main campus is located in the heart of the Condesa-Roma area. Mexico City has two airports: Benito Juárez International Airport (AICM-MEX) and Felipe Ángeles International Airport (AIFA-NLU), also known as *Santa Lucía*. The former is the preferred choice for most travelers, while the latter is a more modern hub and may offer cheaper flights.

5. Airport pick-up:

Universidad La Salle **does not provide airport picking-up service for students**. Upon arrival, students should use an authorized airport taxi. Transportation to the Condesa-Roma area costs approximately \$40.00 USD when arriving at AICM-MEX airport.

6. VISA information:

Student VISA is not required for one semester students. However, candidates must check if they are from a country that requires Visa even if it is not for studying purposes. <https://www.inm.gob.mx/gobmx/word/index.php/paises-requieren-visa-para-mexico/>.

For academic-year students, a student visa must be issued in their home country. [More information here.](#) It should be noted that student visas do not authorize the holder to engage in employment.

7. Cost of living (USD approx./ per month):

Housing: \$300 to \$800; food: \$150 to \$250; transportation: \$10. to \$20; cellphone: \$10 to \$15; other personal expenses: \$100 to \$150

8. Tuition Waiver and Required Fees

Tuition fees are waived for all mobility students. However, a mobility fee of \$3,000.00 MXN is due upon arrival. Students completing an academic-year stay are required to pay an additional mobility fee of \$2,000.00 MXN for the second semester.

SUMMARY INFORMATION

- Home institution must nominate students by sending an email to inter_academico@lasalle.mx. Subsequently, nominees will be asked to upload the required supporting documents (PDFs) via <http://bit.ly/LaSalleInternacional>.
- Candidates must be enrolled as full-time students at their home institution, have completed at least 50% of total credits, have a minimum **GPA of 2.5/4**, and be able to follow courses in Spanish.
- The grading system at Universidad La Salle is based on a scale from 5 to 10, where 6 is the minimum passing grade and 10 denotes excellent performance. The assignment of decimal grades is not applicable within this system.
- Students must attend at least 80% of classes in order to receive a final grade.
- Universidad La Salle does not exempt unattendance under any circumstances.
- For credit conversion purposes, one La Salle credit is equivalent to 0.7 ECTS credits.
- Students must validate courses taken at La Salle with their home institution.
- For undergraduate programs, students must enroll a **minimum of 4** and a **maximum of 9** courses.
- For graduate programs, students must enroll a **minimum of 3** and a **maximum of 5** courses.
- Students must demonstrate an advanced level of Spanish to participate in the mobility program. Spanish language courses are mandatory for students who do not meet the B2 proficiency level; corresponding course fees will apply.
- Tuition fees are waived to mobility students. However, students are asked to pay a mobility fee of **\$3,000.00 MX** upon arrival. For academic-year students, the fee for the second semester is **\$2,000.00 MX**.
- Upon arrival, students must provide a copy of migratory form (FMM) and VISA (if applicable).
